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Returning to the workplace - a new interactive tool for employers

The tool gives tailored information to employers on returning to the workplace, scaling up operations and adapting to workplace changes. It can help to find the information you need when:

- transitioning employees back to the workplace, including lifting a stand down
- changing employees' hours, duties or work location
- introducing alternative working options for staff
- keeping up to date with changes to workplace laws.

As coronavirus restrictions start easing, a number of industries and businesses are starting to operate again. This means that many employers and employees are planning their return to work or to the workplace.

We encourage employers and employees to work together cooperatively as they transition back to work. This includes planning for things like employees starting to work again after being stood down, making changes to start or finish times, or returning to work at their usual workplaces when they've been working from home or another location.

Changes to restrictions

The Australian Government recently announced a [national 3-step plan \(https://www.health.gov.au/news/health-alerts/novel-coronavirus-2019-ncov-health-alert/easing-of-coronavirus-covid-19-restrictions/easing-of-coronavirus-covid-19-restrictions\)](https://www.health.gov.au/news/health-alerts/novel-coronavirus-2019-ncov-health-alert/easing-of-coronavirus-covid-19-restrictions/easing-of-coronavirus-covid-19-restrictions) to relax coronavirus restrictions, with states and territories to decide when to implement these changes locally. The changes affect how and when employers and employees can go back to work or the workplace.

Before employers and employees return to work, it's important that businesses have a plan to keep their workplace safe, healthy and free of coronavirus. It's also important to review the plan regularly so it stays up to date as restrictions change.
